This had not been done by them, so it was decided to postpone the subject until the September Meeting at which Councillors were again reminded, and the matter postponed until this Meeting. · After discussing whether having our own plan would confer any great benefit 3717 beyond that provided by District's Neighbourhood Plan, Clir. Banbury proposed, Clir. Reynolds seconded that the matter by shelved. Carried nem. con. 3718 Planning · Councillors had a summary of outstanding and recently-completed planning 3719 applications, and of headings of applications in neighbouring parishes. 3720 · West Banbury: Change of Use to Care Home C2: 3721 · Cllr. Worden, being a nearby resident to West Banbury, declared an interest, and the Chair for this item was taken by Cllr. Woodard. · This matter drew lengthy discussion, in particular on the questions of: 3722 3723 · safety both to members of the public and (with many natural and artificial hazards around and near the site) to the residents themselves; the eventual numbers of both residents and staff; 3724 · uncertainty as to levels of disability of residents; 3725 · training and retention of staff; 3726 adequacy of 24-hour medical cover; 3727 · what will happen after what is described as *initially* a five-year project:

· some lack of detail and contradiction in those documents:

· serious concerns of nearby (and other) parish residents.

3743	<ul> <li>It is understood from TDC's Head of Finance that it is not necessary to set our precept for the next financial year until our January Meeting provided we let his department know in good time when this will be.</li> </ul>
3744	<ul> <li>Councillors had as usual an up-to-date statement of income and expenditure.</li> </ul>
3745	<ul> <li>Clir. Banbury proposed, Clir. Perkin seconded that the following amounts be paid:</li> </ul>
